Entries sent by express carriers, must have receipt signature requirement waived, or the entry will not be accepted. **Photocopy of Permanent (Yellow) Registration card (NOT the BLUE CARD) will be accepted with entry.** Confirmation will be sent via e-mail whenever possible, so **please print your e-mail address legibly** on your entry. Entry fees are to be payable in **U.S. funds only and only by check, money order or cash.** Entry forms may be photocopies or handwritten, but **MUST** include the agreement in its entirety, and signature. **A separate entry form must be submitted for each dog.**

"CHECK-IN INFO":

All competitors must CHECK-IN between **7:00 & 7:30 AM** on Saturday, July 18th. Competitors **not** entered on Saturday may check-in between **7:15 & 7:30 AM** on Sunday, July 19th. All handlers for a given class should be present at ringside at least 30 minutes prior to the start of scheduled classes for walk-through and briefing.

Any dog and handler not present when their number is called will be ineligible to run unless prior arrangements have been made with the gate steward.

Briefing at 7:45 AM, JUDGING will begin at 8:00 AM on both days.

USDAA requires that registration cards or USDAA authorized check-in letter be available at check-in for ALL dogs. This procedure is to validate registration numbers as recorded on event records so you get credit for any Q's you earn !

- If the dog does not have a Yellow Permanent Registration card, authorized letter / print out from subscriber account indicating the dog is permanently carded, or temporary card with 3 signatures awaiting a CMJ, *the dog must be measured prior to being checked in.* If the dog measures up, it will be placed first in the running order at the higher height. However, should the dog be unprepared for the higher height, it may run For Exhibition Only at the lower jump height, but no awards/qualifying scores may be earned and the dog may not be moved to Performance at check in
- The Test Secretary will accept copies of the USDAA Permanent Card ONLY with the entry form, but the Permanent Card *must still be available to be shown at check in if requested.*
- The final schedule of classes and additional information will be sent via e-mail after the closing date.

General Information (continued)

Running Order & Jump Heights

- Running order is determined by random draw, with every attempt to separate handlers with multiple dogs.
- Change of jump heights will be made *only* when the dog is required to move into a *higher* category by the judge's measure-in. The handler can decide to run FEO (*for exhibition only*) in the lower height; however, no awards or qualifying scores will be earned. No change in program is allowed at check-in..
- Handlers with more than one dog in a class will be separated whenever possible.
- Following are jump heights for the Championship program (Performance heights shown in parentheses):

Prizes and Awards

- First through fourth place ribbons will be awarded in each jump height for all standard and non-standard classes, except Pairs where ribbons will be awarded to mini and open divisions. A maroon qualifying ribbon will be awarded for those achieving a qualifying score in a test class.

Notice to Competitors

Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA Rules and Regulations, including but not limited to the following rules:

- All dogs must be registered with the USDAA to compete. If your dog is NOT registered, you may obtain a registration number immediately and a measurement card prior to the show at www.usdaa.com: click on General Information, click on Dog Registration. You may also fill out the registration form included in this test schedule and submit it along with the registration fee of \$20.00, with your entry.
- This test is open to all USDAA-registered dogs eighteen months of age and over, pure and mixed breeds, except bitches in season, aggressive dogs, and dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance.
- Safety shall be the foremost consideration in the actions and conduct of handlers.
- Handlers and dogs should be familiar with USDAA equipment. Training will not be allowed.
- There will be no familiarization period. A separate "warm-up" area with one jump will be provided near the show area. Please handle your dog in a safe manner for a positive experience and a better chance for success.
- No leads, collars, food, toys, or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time.
- Dogs must remain on leash at all times, except when competing in the ring, or when in the designated area of the warm up jump.
- No dogs may be left unattended, except if properly kenneled. Day kenneling only is permitted. Arrowhead Dog Agility Association does not assume any liability for loss of any items left unattended during this event.
- No training, pinch or shock collars will be permitted on or near the course at any time.
- Fault limits may be imposed if needed at the discretion of the organizing committee and/or judge.
- The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee view that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee.

Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. Portions of this event may be taped for television. Obstacles:

Agility obstacles are chosen from those described in the current edition of the Official Rules and Regulations of the USDAA, Inc.

Behavior of children and dogs

Competitors are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and children. Any competitor whose dogs or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may be asked to leave the show site. No refund will be made.

Refunds

No entry fees will be refunded after the closing date:

- for a dog or handler dismissed from competition, regardless of reason for such dismissal.
- if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of a riot, civil disturbance, fire, act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strike, meteor shower, plague of locusts, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- A portion of Entry Fees for bitches that come in season and for injured dogs after the closing date will be refunded (minus USDAA recording fees and other club costs) if a Veterinarian's certificate is presented to the Trial Secretary prior to the start of judging.
- **There will be no refunds under \$10.00, for overpayment of fees.**

Returned Checks

Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. There will be a \$25 service charge for returned checks. Payment of entry fees and service fees shall be made in cash or money order within 30 days of postmark of notice of returned check where notification is received after event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice shall result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awarded must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is cancelled without recourse by owner/handler.

2010 IFCS WORLD AGILITY COMPETITION

USDAA Class Descriptions

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Two certification programs will be offered at this event – Championship & Performance. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstance may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this agility test (i.e. standard at any level in both programs). Classes include standard agility, gamblers, jumpers, pairs relay and snooker agility as set forth in Chapters 3 – 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels.

Championship Program Classes

The Starters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have not earned the *Agility Dog*[®] title or a Starters Standard title. Starters Non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have not earned a title in the class being entered (Starters Gamblers, Starters Jumpers, Starters Relay-3 different partners required-or Starters Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Advanced or Masters level. When offered separately as Starters and Novice classes, the Starters level classes are for dogs handled by a person who has not previously earned the *Agility Dog* title or a title in the Performance or Veterans Program with any dog. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Agility Dog* title.

The Advanced Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Agility Dog*[®] title or a Starters Standard title. Advanced non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Agility Dog*[®] title or that have earned a title in the equivalent non-standard class at the Starters level, but have not earned the equivalent Advanced non-standard title or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Advanced Agility Dog* title.

The Masters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Advanced Agility Dog*[®] title or the *Advanced Standard* title. Masters non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Advanced Agility Dog*[®] title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Masters non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

Performance Program Classes

Generally, Performance Level I, Level II and Level III are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced and Masters classes in the Championship Program, with the following exceptions: the A-frame is set at 5'6", jump heights are one height class lower as set forth in Notes to Competitors, no spread hurdles are utilized and time standards in the standard, jumpers classes are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program and the pairs relay class is non-qualifying. Eligibility is determined as follows:

The Performance I Standard classes shall be for any dog that has not earned the *Performance Dog I*SM title, the *Performance Standard I* title, or a qualifying score in the Performance II or Performance III standard classes. Performance I non-standard classes shall be for any dog that has not earned a title in the class being entered (Performance I Gamblers, Performance I Jumpers, Performance I Snooker or Performance I Relay) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Performance II or Performance III level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the non-standard classes is required to earn the *Performance Dog I*SM title.

The Performance II Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the *Performance Dog I*SM title, the *Performance Standard I* title, the *Agility Dog*[®] title or the *Veteran Agility Dog*SM title, but has not earned the *Performance Dog II*SM title or *Performance Standard II* title, or a qualifying score in the Performance III standard class. Performance II non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the *Performance Dog I*SM title, the *Agility Dog*[®] title or a title in the equivalent Starters or Performance I non-standard class, but not having earned a title in the equivalent non-standard Performance II class or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard Performance III class. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Performance Dog II*SM title.

The Performance III Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the *Performance Dog II*SM title, the *Performance Standard II* title, the *Advanced Agility Dog*SM title, or the *Veteran Advanced Agility Dog*SM title. Performance III non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the *Performance Dog II*SM title, the *Advanced Agility Dog*[®] title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced or Performance II level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Performance non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

USDAA Class Descriptions (continued)

Non-Standard Class Descriptions

In each of the following descriptions, it can be assumed that the Performance Program parallels the Championship program. Performance I, II, and III parallel Starters, Advanced and Masters levels in the Championship program.

Gamblers Class: This class consists of a course with no predetermined route and each obstacle is assigned a point value. In the "opening" period, the handler seeks to accumulate points by performing the obstacles of her/his choice in the time allotted. At the conclusion of the "opening," the handler attempts the "gamble," a sequence designated by the judge to be handled from a distance for additional points. This nonstandard class is pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of the USDAA Rules and Regulations.

Jumpers Class: This class consists of a course of jumps and may include a tire and tunnels. This nonstandard course is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of the USDAA Rules and Regulations.

Snooker Class: This class has an "opening" sequence of point collection similar to Gamblers, followed by a closing sequence of a set pattern. This class roughly parallels the billiards game of "Snooker," requiring the dog to successfully complete a "red" jump prior to attempting an obstacle designated as any other color. This nonstandard class is pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of the USDAA Rules and Regulations.

Pairs Relay: This class consists of a standard course with one dog and handler running a portion of the course, followed by a baton exchange to a second handler and dog who run the second portion of the course. For both Championship and Performance, partners must be from the same level and in the same height division: Mini Ch 12/16, Perf 8/12 or Open Ch 22/26, Perf 16/22. In the event one dog is entered in a program/level, unentered dogs or dogs from another program/level may NOT be recruited to form a qualifying pair. As of 1/1/09, Relay is required for all levels of Performance. This nonstandard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 6 & 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.
